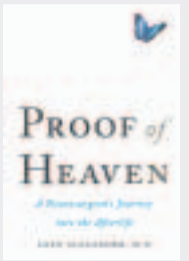

500 Plants: Great Australian favourites for your garden

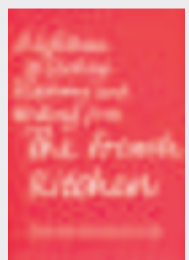
