MELBOURNE is a treasure trove of unique boutiques and specialty stores.

And shopping at them doesn't have to break the bank — when you know where to go.

The authors of the new book *Fashionista's Guide to Shopping in Melbourne*, Emily Power and Antonia Magee, have done the leg work for bargain hunters and those with a bit more cash to splash.

More than 250 shops in the city and suburbs have made the book, many of them among Melbourne's best-kept retail secrets and all of them offering a special shopping experience, from women's fashion, kids' wear and shoes to bridal, vintage and homewares.

"If you think about the little laneways and arcades that Melbourne is famous for, there are a lot of fantastic stores tucked in these little sneaky spots that you do need an insider's word to know about," Power says.

"There are also many, many fantastic businesses in the suburbs that do beautiful things and are worth a visit.

"We wanted people not to be intimidated to go into these stores and experience them. There are a lot of high-end stores in this book, but there are also some fantastic stores where really great value can be found."

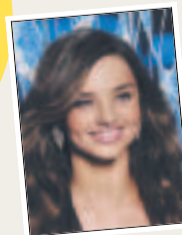
